Subject: Presentation of a Proclamation Honoring Justice Bailey Moseley on his Retirement

A proclamation will be read aloud that designated Tuesday, December 4, 2018, as Justice Bailey C. Moseley Day in honor of his retirement.

PROCLAMATION



WHEREAS, Bailey C. Moseley is a fifth-generation East Texan and a native of Marshall; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from Marshall High School and earning his degree from The University of Texas at Austin, Bailey C. Moseley was awarded a Juris Doctor Degree from the University of Houston College of Law. While in law school, he was the President of his Senior Class and Chief Justice of the Honors Court; and

WHEREAS, upon graduation from law school, Bailey C. Moseley returned to Marshall and began his legal career as an Assistant Criminal District Attorney before entering private practice in Harrison County with his brother, Sam R. Moseley; and

WHEREAS, Bailey C. Moseley served as President of the Harrison County Bar Association and frequently served as an instructor for Continuing Legal Education programs sponsored by the Texas State Bar, and on the governing Council of the Real Estate, Probate and Trust Law Section of the Texas Bar. He also served as a member of the State Bar's Committee on Admissions as well as serving as director of the Texas College of Real Estate Attorneys; and

WHEREAS, Bailey C. Moseley is a leader in his church having served as Chairman of its governing board. Earlier, he was one of the founders of the Marshall Soccer Association for the young people in Marshall and was instrumental in the founding of the local chapter of Habitat for Humanity. The citizens of Marshall elected him to the charter revision commission and he served as a Trustee of the Public Library Board, as well as a Planning and Zoning Commissioner for the City of Marshall, and on the Board of Directors of the Cypress Valley Navigation District before being elected in 2006 and reelected in 2012 to the 6th District Court of Appeals for the State of Texas, where he has faithfully and honorably served as Justice for twelve years.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Larry Hurta, Chairman of the Marshall City Commission, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, December 4, 2018, as

JUSTICE BAILEY C. MOSELEY DAY
