369. TOWN HALL MEETING FOR AN OPEN DISCUSSION BETWEEN CITIZENS, CITY COMMISSIONERS, AND CITY STAFF REGARDING ISSUES OF INTEREST WITHIN THE COMMUNITY.

Chairman Smith opened the Town Hall Meeting for an open discussion between citizens, City Commissioners, and City Staff regarding issues of interest within the community. Chairman Smith introduced the City Commission and City Staff.

The following individuals spoke, and issues were addressed by City Commissioners and City Staff:

Judge Clarice Watkins, 709 Wood Street, stated her concerns regarding the dilapidated house located at 711 Wood Street.

Gail Beil, 500 Henley Perry, would like to know the ordinance regarding cars parked on lawns and cars parked for extended periods of time.

Nina J. Hodge, 106 Nolan Street, stated concerns regarding the drainage problems at the north end of Nolan Street.

Mrs. Charles Wilson, 706 Whetstone, spoke concerning the drainage on West Houston. She expressed thanks for City Staff cleaning the trash from Rusk Street and putting up guard rails. She also thanked the Commission for hiring the new Police Chief.

Leo Morris, 4500 Victory Drive #45, stated concerns regarding drainage on North Franklin. Mr. Morris also voiced concerns about the future vision of the City's infrastructure needs.

Janice Rosborough, spoke on behalf of Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church at 1300 Billups Avenue, asking for improvement of that street and removal of dilapidated structures on Dogan Street. She also expressed concerns regarding the property at 1301 Billups Avenue, stating it is overgrown and unsightly.

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Joyce Pickard invited the City Commission to come out in support of homeowners and justice for her family on October 31, 2014.

Chairman Smith thanked everyone for attending the Town Hall Meeting and invited the citizens of Marshall to attend the reception Friday, October 24, 2014 to meet the candidates for City Manager.


Commissioner Timmins moved to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Calhoun seconded the motion which passed with a vote of 6:0.
