To the Marshall City Commission,

During the 77<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative Session (2001), Senate Bill 1074 passed, mandating the prohibition of racial profiling. In order to comply with the mandates of this legislation, law enforcement agencies in Texas are required to compile, collect, and analyze statistical information relating to traffic stops as it pertains to race. Senate Bill 1074 established what data must be collected and also set forth certain criteria for the reporting procedures based on whether or not a particular law enforcement agency utilizes video cameras to record their traffic and pedestrian stops. The data that must be collected include: citations issued and/or arrest(s) made; race or ethnicity of the person(s) detained; whether or not a search was conducted and if so, was the search consensual.

Racial profiling has been defined as a law enforcement-initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity. A peace officer must have probable cause to make a stop, other than the race of the driver. After the stop is made, the resulting consequences, such as a person being wanted, the issuance of a citation, or a search either conducted consensually or as an inventory search is not defined as racial profiling.

The Marshall Police Department submits a TIER 1 – PARTIAL EXEMPTION RACIAL PROFILING REPORT because all marked police vehicles used to make traffic stops and pedestrian stops are equipped with audio and video equipment. The Police Department also maintains all recordings for a minimum period of 90 days.


This report provides statistical data relevant to the public contacts made during the period of January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.



 (Includes Arrests for Outstanding Warrants)


